THE BEGINNING

In the mid 60's, the Pastor, the Church Council, the members of Christ Lutheran Church and other interested parties, proposed an idea to meet the Personal Care needs of Senior members of our community. This could be achieved by building 1081 Andrews, Luther Home. Funds were raised to purchase the land for the project and to cover the cost of a percentage of the construction of an eighty bed facility. The Provincial Government of the day recognized the need, supported the proposal and passed legislation, BILL 44, in 1968 for the building to begin.





The Founding members named in the legislation were Walter T. Weind, Edward Hilderman, Maurice Solomon, Albert Rothenberger, Geoffrey Harman and Matthew Shrofel. These were all members of Christ Lutheran Church. As bylaws were written for the new Corporation Board, membership was expanded to include members of other Lutheran Churches and members from the community at large. Oscar Domke joined the group and remained a vital contributor. The facility opened in December of 1969 with Residents being admitted gradually until it reached capacity of 80 shortly thereafter. Luther Home continues to serve with Love and Compassion after 50 years.









In the early 1970's an adjacent property became available for sale. It was 1084 Powers, a 48-suite apartment block built shortly before the Personal Care Home.

Recognizing the need for independent living, and affordable senior's housing, the board acted quickly to make an offer, purchase, then renovate this property. Included in this renovation were the following major projects:

- Addition of an elevator, accessing all three floors
- Modifying eight suites for wheelchair accessibility
- Joining 1084 Powers and 1081 Andrews

As part of a "Community living program" the group home at 364 Leila was built. This home was built to meet the needs of disabled adults who could no longer live with elderly parents in their own home. Land for 364 Leila was purchased and construction for a six bedroom home was completed in 1986. This facility has recently provided a safe home for refugees in the West Kildonan area and will continue to evolve into the future.

Through its evolution as a centre of love and compassion and faithful witness in the community, it became evident that a dedicated staff person be engaged to meet the spiritual needs of our Residents. The Pastor of Christ Lutheran Church gradually relinquished these services to a new staff person called the Spiritual Care Coordinator. Regular worship services provided in multiple faiths, counselling and companion services, bible studies and participation in off site faith based activities ensued. In 1985, an expansion of the Activity space to include a chapel site was dedicated. In 2005, the current Chapel and Family room were added on the North West corner of 1081 Andrews.



In 1992 a second Senior's Housing unit was added to complete our Luther Home Campus. Tenants at 1080 Powers had a meal plan included as part of their rent allowing for tenants who needed more assistance with nutrition and meal prep to have a healthy option. At the same time, the food services for the Personal Care Home were provided through the state of the art kitchen at 1080 Powers. The Board's decision to fund this service allowed us to provide our Residents and tenants with high quality yet economic meals and remain independent of more institutional style hospital food services.

In the past space at 1080 Powers has served as a home for the Luxton Play Centre, a program for Mom's and Pre-schoolers. Recently this space has become a dedicated staff training area and a computer learning centre for some of our tenants..













Our most recent addition was the renovation of the Sunroom Link space between 1081 Andrews and 1084 Powers. This project totally rebuilt the glass area and expanded the activity area providing a bright comfortable space to celebrate our 50th Anniversary. Residents, tenants, staff, families and Board Members raised funds to complete the refurnishing of the space through two bake sales and additional donations. The Community spirit, which was evident during this project, is an example of the enthusiasm and support within our walls. The legacy of Christ Lutheran Church is present in the link through the stained glass hanging in the lounge area. The memory of those who pioneered the Luther Home concept of Family will live on as we begin another 50 years welcoming those in need and ministering to their needs with love and compassion.


